The pictures are now all in, the first round of the judging is more or less complete and the final round of voting is about to start early next week.


So by this time next week we will know who the winners are. But everyone who entered and took part in any way, are really the winners.

86 growers entered, representing 27 societies. This includes some entries from Australia and some non-society members. There were just under 400 plants which resulted in about 800 images to process and enter onto the website. So far more than 42 judges, both trainees and qualified, have joined in the judging process. This is brilliant!! Especially when you consider that some people who entered had never taken photographs, certainly never renamed files, let alone attach them to an email!! We all went through a very steep learning curve.

How many people recognised Arnold Chieveley ?


He hasn't really changed that much (second picture) especially if you consider that the picture was taken over 20 years ago at the London Orchid Show!

These pictures were sent from Australia, as it was thought we might be interested to see *Dendrobium aumulum* growing in the wild.

The plant was found adjacent to a 'bushwalk' on the outskirts of the Port Macquarie on the Pacific shore of Australia .



"My cousin sent me photographs of the plant early last year when she saw that flower spikes were just beginning to show and sent these photographs when the plant was in full flower. She managed to contact the local Orchid Society who identified it for her, but in the meantime I had contacted several of my colleagues in East Midlands Orchid Society who also found an identity. It is interesting that one Australian East Coast Orchid website identified it as *Dendrobium speciosum* - which it definitely is not - alongside several photos of *speciosum* on the same webpage."
